Dear McLean Patients, Residents, and Families,

As a follow-up to yesterday's letter, we are working to implement the new visitation guidelines and are waiting for further information from the Governor's office. This pertains to visitation for our residents in skilled nursing and we have chosen to include our assisted living residents as well since they share the same living space. Thank you for your patience as we work through these changes together.

Starting this weekend, the Well Screen machine will be asking if you have received your booster shot. Starting next Tuesday, we will start reviewing the vaccination cards and COVID-19 test results.

Once we start our process, this is what you can expect.....

**If you are fully vaccinated (14 days have elapsed since you received the final dose of the COVID-19 vaccine) and have received the booster shot**

- bring your vaccination card or an electronic version of it with you when you visit McLean
- we do not need a copy of the card
- we will make a note that we have seen your card and you may enter at any time

**If you are fully vaccinated, but not eligible for the booster (has not been five months since your last Pfizer or Moderna shot or two months since your J & J shot)**

- bring your vaccination card or an electronic version of it with you when you visit McLean
- we do not need a copy of the card
- we will make a note that we have seen your card and you may enter at any time

**If you are fully vaccinated AND eligible for a booster, but have NOT received a booster shot yet**

- please test outside of McLean prior to visiting
- this can be an antigen rapid test or PCR test

- provide paper or electronic proof of a negative rapid antigen test result within the previous 48 hours or a negative PCR test that was completed within the previous 72 hours
- if you do not show proof of a negative test, you will need to be tested here at McLean before your visit – there may be a delay in order to wait for the testing area to be available and you must wait 15 minutes for the test to process
- we will be arranging times through SimplyBook.Me in order to schedule testing prior to your visit
- retesting will be needed if visiting after 48 hours of the last antigen test

**If you are not fully vaccinated and have not received the booster shot**

- please test outside of McLean prior to visiting
- this can be an antigen rapid test or PCR test
- provide paper or electronic proof of a negative rapid antigen test result within the previous 48 hours or a negative PCR test that was completed within the previous 72 hours
- if you do not show proof of a negative test, you will need to be tested here at McLean before your visit – there may be a delay in order to wait for the testing area to be available and you must wait 15 minutes for the test to process
- we will be arranging times through SimplyBook.Me in order to schedule testing prior to your visit
- retesting will be needed if visiting after 48 hours of the last antigen test

Under the executive order, we can deny entrance to any visitor or essential support person who tests positive OR anyone who refuses to take a rapid antigen test. We cannot deny entry to anyone willing to take a rapid antigen test, but is unable to do so because we are not able to provide the test.

Again, we will be in touch with more information early next week. We sincerely appreciate your support as we work through the details.
